What is Creative Arts:- Photography?

Students actively participate in the processes and development of the presentation of creative digital photographic products. Students build a sense of aesthetic standards and appraise creative arts products

Why study Creative Arts:- Photography?

- To develop ICT skills in Photoshop CS3
- To gain confidence and ability in visual literacy
- To gain an understanding of the role of creative expression in personal and cultural endeavours
- To develop a folio of personal work to give evidence of photographic skills and abilities
- To experience all phases of the creative process including investigation, exploration, experimentation, production, refinement, resolution and evaluation

Course content of Creative Arts :- Photography

The course covers the following areas:

- Creative Arts Process
- Development and Production
- Concepts in Creative Arts Disciplines
- Creative Arts in Practice

Assessment in Creative Arts:- Photography consists of the following assessment types, weighted as shown:

Learning Outcomes of the Course

At the end of the program in Stage 1 Creative Arts – Photography, students will have gained and/or experienced:

- Knowledge and understanding of core concepts, language and terminologies specific to photography
- Knowledge of creative arts media, materials, techniques, processes, and technologies
- Individual and collaborative work
- Use of practical skill, techniques and processes to work creatively
- Investigation into the nature and processes of working creatively
- Reflection on photographic products in terms of practitioners' ideas, processes and decision making

Future Pathways in Creative Arts:- Photography

Study in this subject could lead to Stage 2 Visual Art, and then further studies in the Visual Arts at Tafe Colleges, Universities or Art Schools. Students also gain a range of life skills and employment opportunities. The ability to work collaboratively in teams to produce successful outcomes is also part of the learning process. Students develop an understanding of photographic techniques and an insight into the practices of contemporary photographers.

Required Text(s) for Creative Arts:- Photography

None, students are required to own a 2 GB USB minimum to store images.

What are the prerequisites?

No specific requirements but access to a digital camera would be an advantage. Students should have a genuine interest in Creative Arts and be willing to take an innovative approach to personalised learning. A passing grade in Year 10 English is required.
