Trinity 1st XI 122 defeated Blackfriars 117

Trinity won the toss and elected to bat on what was a scorcher of a day. Trinity got off to a steady start before losing a couple of wickets. Alex Cotter came in and hit a superb 49 including several sixes down the ground. Trinity found themselves at 3-86 after 20 overs, but poor batting let Blackfriars back into the game.

Cotter was the only one to hold the bat as Trinity were bowled out for 122. Travis Woolgar and Jaime Forwood (2/7) opened the bowling superbly. Woolgar took early wickets, really putting Blackfriars on the back foot. The tandem spin combination bowling between Marc Roberts (1/17) and Sam Lee (1/24) worked beautiful as both of them ripped through the Blackfriars middle order. Roberts produced one of the best bowling spells of the season to give Trinity the upper edge.

Blackfriars were hanging on with a solid partnership that could not be broken down by the Trinity bowlers. Woolgar came back on with the score at 7/117 and claimed 3/0 to win Trinity the match. Woolgar finished with amazing figures of (6/39)

SASSSA A Grade Carnival

Trinity College participated in the SASSSA swimming carnival on Wednesday 5th March. After winning both boys and girls events in the B grade carnival in 2007, Trinity was promoted to A grade for 2008. Swimmers performed creditably, with the boys achieving 3rd place and the girls achieving 4th place in a very strong field. Pembroke School were the overall winners of both the boys and girls events.

Outstanding results were achieved by Tigri Mema and Tristan Horewood, who both achieved first place in 4 of the 5 events they contested. Excellent relay results demonstrated the depth of the Trinity team, with the U14 and U15 boys and open girls winning their freestyle relays, and the U16 boys freestyle team and the open girls medley team achieving third place.

Numerous students achieved standards, with Tristan Horewood, Alicia Hurkmans, Tigri Mema and Taylor Ritenberg reaching standards in three events.

Teams Championship

Trinity College entered the School Teams Championships on Friday 7th March. This is a relays only swimming carnival which attracts entries from schools around the state. Trinity entered teams in both freestyle and medley relays, in the Year 7 and under, Year 8 and 9, and the Year 10 – 12 age groups.

The school performed extremely well, with Trinity teams reaching finals in 11 out of 12 events. The best results were achieved by the Year 8 – 9 boys team of Dylan Flavel, Tristan Horewood, Tigri Mema and Jonathan Targett who won gold medals in both the freestyle and medley relay. The Year 7 and below boys team of Joshua Bedford, Heath Belton, James McKechnie and Lucas Ordish won silver medals in both relays, while the Year 10 – 12 girls team of Bonnie Howarth, Alicia Hurkmans, Taylor Ritenberg and Jessie Sims won two bronze medals. The Year 7 and below girls team of Kya Grech, Lottie Hadlum, Rachel Kendall and Caitlin Westell won bronze in the freestyle relay.
