In 1984 a small group of committed Anglican families from Gawler established the beginnings of the College in the Church Hall at St George's Church. 27 children attended on that first day, a day that has led to the development of an institution that still firmly adheres to its founding principles – to establish a college of excellence, open to all in a caring, Christian environment.

Today, Trinity is still low-fee and has grown to be the largest College in Australia and now supports 2,300 families, with children in Preschool to Year 12. Our five schools enable personalised care and feature quality facilities, modern comfortable classrooms and landscaped grounds.

Where we go tomorrow depends on the continued generosity and passionate vision of community members just like you.

Trinity College Foundation was formed in 1995 by a group of people brought together by their desire to enhance the lives of the College community.

The role of the Foundation Board is to support Trinity College in developing, maintaining and enhancing the first class educational facilities and resources available for its current and future students.

While tuition fees and government grants cover a major portion of a child's education at Trinity College, the commitment of the College to provide an education of excellence is achievable due to the ongoing generosity of the wider Trinity community.

# **OUR PROJECTS**

Sun Shades – Senior, North, Blakeview, South and Gawler River

More than \$75 000 was raised over two years to help install sun shades by ovals across all five schools. The shades reduce overall exposure to the sun's harmful ultraviolet (UV) radiation by up to 75%.

## How you can help

The lives of the students at Trinity College have been enriched by those who have helped shape our College by giving in the past – now you can play a part in ensuring the generous spirit that helped shaped our College continues.

You can give to Trinity in a number of tax deductible ways. Gifts to the Foundation may come from individuals, families, companies or organisations. The Foundation offers 6 levels of membership, according to the donated amount;

- Member (gifts of \$100 but less than \$1,000)
- Fellow (gifts up to \$5,000)
- Companion (gifts up to \$10,000)
- Ambassador (gifts up to \$25,000)
- Benefactor (gifts up to \$60,000)
- Patron (gifts of more than \$60,000)

The Foundation will acknowledge all donations under \$100 as a gift contribution to the Foundation. Gifts aggregated over time qualify for membership.

All Foundation donors will be acknowledged in the Trinity Times annually and listed on the Trinity College website. All Member levels and higher will be acknowledged annually at a Foundation event. Patrons, Benefactors and Ambassadors will be recognised on a permanent Foundation Honour Board.

### Options to Give
