RESULTS

231 students attempted to complete the SACE at the end of 2008. Of these:

- Nearly 89% gained their SACE
- 84% gained a TER
- 8 students gained 9 Merits (20s)
- 130 students applied to university and 89% were successful
- A record 64 students applied to TAFE and 86% were successful

Thus the students who had higher academic ambitions did do well, but it also was a record year for the number of students who have successfully applied for TAFE, apprenticeship and traineeship positions. It is also pleasing to note the large number of students who have been successful in their completion of the SACE.
