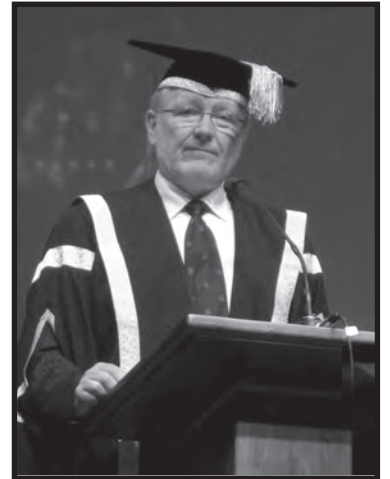

YEAR 12 RESULTS - 2009

238 students attempted to complete their SACE by the end of 2009.

Of these students:

- 96 were boys (40%)
- 142 were girls (60%)

Over 99% gained their SACE, the highest pass percentage to date

- 100% of boys
- 99% of girls

84% gained a TER

- 81% of boys
- 87% of girls
