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## What Is LAP?

- A student-centred, volunteer mentor-based program to support great learning outcomes.
- Students access LAP for a wide range of reasons, for example, support with or motivation for school work, extending a skill or talent, building confidence for learning, supporting social success, and working with a valued role model.
- Any student from Early Years to Year 10 whose schooling may benefit from 1:1 mentoring can be considered for LAP.

## LAP at Trinity College

LAP provides personalised mentoring to more than 100 students across the College. LAP Mentors work with their matched student at school for a single lesson (50 minutes) each week. The LAP Mentor collaborates with the LAP Coordinator, student and teacher to plan activities tailored to that student's particular needs, using a creative approach to learning. LAP Mentoring sessions are less formal than traditional classroom lessons and activities may include practical and creative activities, sport, games, music, using technology or more traditional schoolwork. The key is that the session be fun, valuable, safe and a positive experience for both student and Mentor.

- Where: At your choice of Trinity Schools
- When: One hour per week at a time/day that suits the Volunteer Mentor.
- Who: Volunteer Mentors are matched with nominated student, Reception to Year 10, based on common interests.
