





Overview

Trinity College is one of the largest independent schools in Australia with a current enrolment of 3,700 students. The College has consciously divided itself into five schools, across three sites, and supports 2,600 families, with children in Preschool to Year 12. Trinity College has four Reception to Year 10 schools, namely Trinity College Blakeview, Trinity College Gawler River, Trinity College North, and Trinity College South while all Year 11s and 12s join together to comprise Trinity College Senior. Trinity College additionally contains a Montessori Preschool, a farm and equestrian centre, an outdoor education property, a first class sports, health, arts and entertainment complex known as STARplex, an innovation and creativity hub and features state-of-the-art facilities, modern comfortable classrooms and landscaped grounds.

Students come from a cross-section of backgrounds, and come from as far as Clare in the north to Gepps Cross in the south. Our students thrive with clear behavioural expectations, and their talents are nurtured by our extensive curricular and co-curricular programs; we strive to find opportunities for each individual to shine.

Trinity College is a warm and friendly place with exceptional facilities, excellent staff and an outstanding sense of community.

Our student-centred focus enables us to develop positive and confident young men and women ready to change the world for the better. We pride ourselves on fostering a love of learning and a love of life. Our schools have a solid Christian foundation, in the Anglican tradition, to ensure the personal and spiritual development of each student. Trinity's Anglican tradition enhances the sense of community felt by its students, the joy of living they are encouraged to experience and the support available in the face of challenge. The lived College motto is 'In God is my Faith.'

Our dedicated staff are well resourced and committed to ensuring a culture of respect, support and success; the spirit of 'doing your best' penetrates every area of Trinity College.

Our History

The Trinity College story began in 1984 when a small group of committed families from Gawler began operation with 27 students in the hall at St George's Anglican Church.

In 1985 the College moved to its current location of Alexander Avenue in Evanston Park and expanded to sites at Blakeview and Angle Vale. Since then Trinity College has undergone significant growth and development but remains an institution that adheres to its founding principles.

Trinity College is open to all who would like their children educated in a liberal and Anglican tradition regardless of their economic status or religious affiliation.

The vision and pioneering spirit of dedicated staff, parents and students has seen Trinity College grow into an extraordinary educational institution offering Preschool to Year 12.

Now into its fourth decade of operation, Trinity College has become widely recognised for the pursuit of excellence for all.

Five Schools One College

At Trinity College, students get the best of all worlds. They receive the benefits and facilities of a large modern college, along with the personalised and individual attention traditionally associated with smaller schools.

Each school has its own full-time staff, both teaching and non-teaching, who are complimented by the central administration of the College.

Trinity College is governed by the Trinity College Board who appoints the Head of Trinity College to oversee all College operations. School Principals report directly to the Head.









At Trinity College our greatest asset is our people.

Offering a balance of experience, youth and gender, our professional and highly trained teachers are recognised as some of the best in their field. When recruiting new staff, we have a set of firm criteria that candidates must meet. These include teaching qualifications and experience, a commitment to the Christian ethos of the College, the ability to create a disciplined and caring environment, and high quality personal references.

Our Support and Administration staff are excellent and along with a dedicated team of volunteers greatly add to the quality environment at Trinity College.

We are proud of the quality and standing of our staff, and our low staff turnover is testimony to our commitment to attracting, developing, supporting and retaining the best staff we can. Staff are encouraged to pursue professional development opportunities, and are actively involved in the planning and development of the College.

One of the main roles of our teachers is to make students feel welcome at Trinity College, and to provide an environment where children strive to be the best they can be. We believe that a student's emotional health contributes significantly to educational success – not to mention a happy and productive life in general.

With this in mind, Trinity College's pastoral care system, built around class and house structures, is a vital part of life at the College, providing a support service for both students and parents. In addition, each school has Chaplaincy, counselling and learning support.

We run three Outside School Hours Care centres with designated staff, who also manage vacation care programs.







Trinity College Senior

Trinity College Senior is located at Gawler in the northern region of Adelaide. It provides education for Year 11 and 12 students with students feeding in from the four Reception to Year 10 Trinity College Schools. Trinity College Senior has 600 students.

Trinity College Senior is a learning community committed to providing the finest in contemporary educational practice and offering the most appropriate learning opportunities for all its students. At Trinity College our focus is on understanding and valuing each student in a positive, academically challenging environment.

Students are at the centre of learning at Trinity and all decisions relating to student well-being, pastoral care, pedagogy, curriculum and assessment are made with this in mind. This means programs and courses are case managed to equip all students with the knowledge, skills and attitudes to help them achieve individual long term goals.

Academic programs embrace both SACE and trade options with a very wide range of subjects made possible by the size of the College. There is strong commitment to boost engagement and achievement in all students.

The curricular program is complemented by an extraordinary array of co-curricular opportunities featuring the full range of cultural, sporting, musical, artistic and extension pursuits.

Community and parental involvement to enhance educational opportunities are key components of the school.

The College uses the School Box Learning Management System and has embraced an extensive use of digital technology to boost learning and improve communication.







Academic Snapshot

Each year Trinity College has the largest number, from South Australian schools, of students graduating with their South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE).

Since inception, we have consistently produced graduates who attain an ATAR in the top 1% of the State.

Recent results have regularly included SACE merit certificates, Governor of South Australia Prize winners and University entrance prize winners. The majority of our graduates gain University entrance.


The College has extensive pre-university and vocational pathways available. Trinity College Vocational Education Training (VET) graduates are highly sought after and receive quality apprenticeship offers.

Opportunities

Trinity College offers a superb range of subjects enabling students to select a path that best meets their individual learning needs.

We cater to a range of learning styles including extension for gifted and talented students and provide specialised learning support programs. Traditional and experiential teaching methods are used to develop competence and confidence in all skills with special focus on literacy and numeracy.

We have a Learning Assistance Program (LAP) with designated volunteers to help students.

Core subjects such as English, Maths, Science, Health and Physical Education, Geography, History and Religious and Values Education underpin the curriculum. These are complemented by a mix of compulsory and optional subjects including Arts, Drama, ICT, Agricultural Studies, Music, Dance, Psychology, Design Technology, Chinese, French, Outdoor Education and Home Economics.

Focus on the whole child through co-curricular participation in music, the arts, outdoor education and sport is very high, with amazing teaching/coaching expertise and facilities such as STARplex, the health and well-being centre which is open to the wider community, boosting outcomes of every kind.

The College musical, bands, choirs, debating; extension activities such as robotics, tournament of minds and a thriving arts culture are all features.

- A commitment to the Christian ethos of the College





Remuneration

The appointment is for a senior position and the salary package and contract reflect this.

The successful candidate will be required to embrace College-wide events and support the College's co-curricular program. The position is offered as a full-time role on a fixed term of five years with a mandatory probation period. Within this role, there is a requirement to undertake 0.2 FTE teaching load.
