



## Trinity College SACE Results 2016

Trinity College wishes to congratulate all Year 12 students on their excellent results for 2016!

- 287 students achieved their SACE, the highest number ever from Trinity College.
- The top 13 students achieved an ATAR above 97, placing them in the top 3% of Australia.
- 56 students received an ATAR above 90, placing them in the top 10% of Australia, this is the equal highest number in the history of the College. Amazingly, another 10 students scored between 89.0 and 89.9!
- 446 'A' grades were achieved, comfortably a College record!
- Four learning support students achieved their Modified SACE, an outstanding achievement!

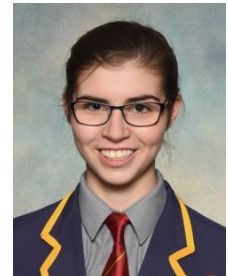
